

## Corrigendum—Chiropractic Board APC and Disciplinary Levy Fees Notice

Pursuant to sections 130–133 of the Health Practitioners Competence Assurance Act 2003, Te Poari Kaikorohiti o Aotearoa; the Chiropractic Board (“Board”) gives notice that the following fees are payable effective **27 February 2026**.

This notice revokes and replaces all previous Board fees notices published in the *New Zealand Gazette*. The Board agreed to reinstate the disciplinary levy for the 2026/2027 APC year and will re-evaluate the levy and APC fees for the subsequent APC year.

All fees charged by the Board are non-refundable, in \$NZD and inclusive of goods and services tax (GST) of 15%.

### Explanatory Note

#### Changes to Disciplinary Levy

In November 2025, the Board consulted on the proposed reinstatement of a disciplinary levy for the 2026/2027 Annual Practising Certificate year. The levy had previously been paused and disciplinary costs met from the Board’s reserves; however, it is no longer appropriate to use general reserves to sustainably fund ongoing disciplinary activity.

The consultation outlined the increasing costs associated with investigations and disciplinary processes required under the Health Practitioners Competence Assurance Act 2003. Feedback received through consultation was considered, and the Board resolved to reinstate the levy at a lower level than previously applied.

The decision followed a review of the Board’s financial position and is consistent with its reserves and fee-setting policies.
