

# Consultation Outcomes: Professional Standards Policies

In February 2022, the Chiropractic Board (the Board) published a consultation document proposing a suite of professional standard policies for Complaints, Disciplinary and Fitness to Practice (health) notifications.

## **Consultation Overview**

Consultation respondents were asked to provide their feedback via email. The following questions were put to the profession for consideration:

- 1. Do you agree with the draft policies?
- 2. Do you believe there are other considerations to be made in respect of the draft policies?
- 3. Do you have any other comments you would like to make?

Two practitioners, ACC and NZCA provided comments.

## Results

#### Fitness to practice (health) policy:

There were no suggested changes.

#### **Complaints policy:**

- No general comments were made regarding this policy.
- Clause 22 should include informing ACC via email

#### Competency review policy:

- Requested definition for "complaint" to be included.
- Requested for hyperlinks to HPCA sections where and as mentioned throughout the document.
- Asked for clarification regarding oversight versus supervision
- One question was asked if it was fair for the practitioner to be responsible for the ongoing costs of a competency programme.

# **Board decision**

Hyperlinks and the definition for complaints were included where appropriate, and a reference to the Board's supervision policy was included to clarify oversight versus supervision.

The Board pays for all costs associated with a competence review; however, the ongoing costs associated with a competence programme as a result of a competency review are met by the practitioner.

The Board approved to adopt these policies.
